Dear Senator Merkley, Senator Lummis, Congressman Joyce, Congresswoman Bonamici, Congresswoman Kiggans, and Congresswoman Underwood,

On behalf of the 60 undersigned organizations representing the Nursing Community Coalition (NCC), we would like to thank you for introducing the *Improving Care and Access to Nurses (I CAN) Act* (S.575/H.R. 1317). The NCC is a cross section of education, practice, research, and regulation within the nursing profession representing Registered Nurses (RNs), Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs),¹ nurse leaders, students, faculty, and researchers. Together, we support this comprehensive effort to ensure patients, including those under Medicare and Medicaid, have access to the high-quality care provided by our nation's APRNs.

From primary and maternal care to acute and chronic care, APRNs serve in all settings and in areas throughout the nation, including rural and underserved communities. As of 2020, over 233,000 APRNs treated Medicare patients and approximately 40% of Medicare

beneficiaries received care from an APRN.² The I CAN Act would remove outdated barriers in the Medicare and Medicaid programs that currently prevent APRNs from practicing to the full extent of their education and clinical training. Removing these barriers will increase patients' timely access to care from the provider of their choice and is consistent with recommendations from a broad range of organizations, including the National Academy of Medicine, the National Governors Association, the National Rural Health Association, the Federal Trade Commission, the Bipartisan Policy Center, the Brookings Institution, Americans for Prosperity, and the American Enterprise Institute.

As we continue to support the health care of our communities throughout the country and reduce unnecessary barriers to care to ensure the efficient delivery of high-quality care to all Americans, passing the I CAN Act is essential. We appreciate your leadership in this effort as we work to address today's challenges and prepare for a healthier tomorrow.
